Biography

Representative Stephen Allison was elected to the House in 2008. He is Chairman of the House Special Rules Committee and the former Chief Deputy Whip for the House Caucus. He serves on the House Appropriations, Judiciary, Energy and Telecommunications and Juvenile Justice Committees. While serving in the House, Stephen has sponsored a variety of different legislation including, the Physicians for Rural Areas Assistance Act, which authorizes the State Medical Education Board to offer grants to enhance recruitment efforts to bring physicians to underserved rural areas of Georgia and was the House sponsor of SB 33, the Zero Based Budgeting Act of 2012, which was signed by Governor Nathan Deal and will bring greater transparency and accountability into the state's budget process. He has been a recipient of the "Defender of Liberty Award" and the Environmental Leadership Award from the Georgia Conservation Voters, as well as "Legislator of Year" by the Georgia Firefighters Association.

When he's not serving under the Gold Dome, Stephen practices law in Union County which he has called home for over 15 years. He lives in Blairsville with his wife, Regina, and their two sons, Thomas and Nathan.
