

LOCAL LEGISLATION CALENDAR

GEORGIA HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

HB 496 by Representative Allison of the 8th

RABUN COUNTY: A Bill to create the Rabun County Water and Sewer Authority and to provide for its powers and duties.

HB 526 by SUBSTITUTE by Representative Willard of the 51st

FULTON COUNTY: A Bill to create the North Fulton Regional Radio System Authority and to provide for its powers and duties.

HB 527 by SUBSTITUTE by Representative Jones of the 47th

FULTON COUNTY: A Bill to amend the charter of the City of Milton so as to clarify the cap on the millage rate for ad valorem property taxes, to revise the term limits on the mayor and city council, to provide that the affirmative vote of five councilmembers shall be required to override a veto, and to provide for the selection and term of a mayor pro tempore.

HB 545 by Representative Waites of the 60th

CLAYTON COUNTY: A Bill to create the Metropolitan Atlanta Aerotropolis Development Authority in Clayton County and to provide for its powers and duties.

HB 548 by Representative Golick of the 40th

COBB COUNTY: A Bill to reapportion the city council of the City of Smyrna.

HB 556 by Representative Smyre of the 135th

COLUMBUS/MUSCOGEE COUNTY: A Bill to authorize the Recorder's Court of Columbus/Muscogee County to impose and collect a technology fee, not to exceed \$15.00 for each fine imposed.

HB 557 by Representative McCall of the 33rd

MADISON COUNTY: A Bill to amend the charter of the City of Danielsville to provide for staggered, four-year terms for the mayor and council, to provide that the city clerk may serve as the city treasurer to provide that the municipal judge shall be a licensed attorney, to provide that the office of elected officials of 6 the city shall be vacated under certain circumstances.

HB 558 by Representative McCall of the 33rd

MADISON COUNTY: A Bill to amend the charter of the City of Colbert to provide for staggered, four-year terms of office for the mayor and council; to provide for related matters; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

PURSUANT TO ARTICLE VII, SECTION II, PARAGRAPH IV OF THE CONSTITUTION, THE FOLLOWING LOCAL BILLS RELATING TO HOMESTEAD EXEMPTIONS REQUIRE A TWO-THIRDS ROLL-CALL VOTE FOR PASSAGE:

HB 330 by SUBSTITUTE by Representative Glanton of the 75th

CLAYTON COUNTY: A Bill to restate the homestead exemption from all City of Jonesboro ad valorem taxes for municipal purposes to the amount of \$10,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for residents of that city and repeals an earlier Act which previously granted a homestead exemption from City of Jonesboro ad valorem taxes for municipal purposes.

SB 201 by Senator Gooch of the 51st

WHITE COUNTY: A Bill to provide a homestead exemption from White County school district ad valorem taxes for educational purposes in the amount of \$100,000.00 of the assessed value of the homestead for residents of that school district who are 70 years of age or older and whose income, not including certain retirement income, does not exceed \$25,000.00.
