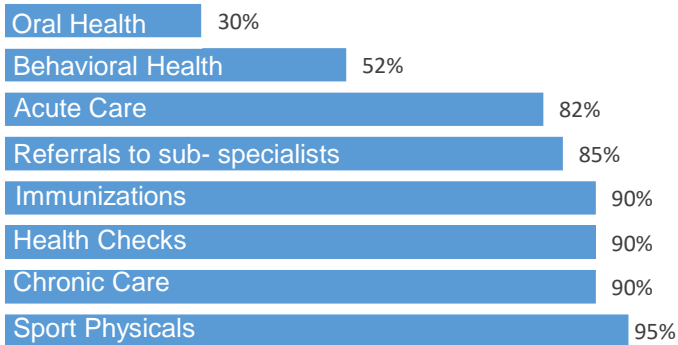


Georgia school-based health centers (SBHCs) promote quality healthcare, wellness, and academic success for Georgia's children. They are a collaborative partnership between the school and healthcare providers. In 2012, there were 2 SBHCs in Georgia; today, there are 47 SBHCs in the state and growing!

Services Provided by SBHCs



Population Served

- 97%** serve children enrolled in the school
- 79%** serve school staff and faculty
- 70%** serve siblings of enrolled children
- 61%** serve children in the community

Health Outcomes (3 sites evaluated)



95% of students receive psycho-social screenings during health checks

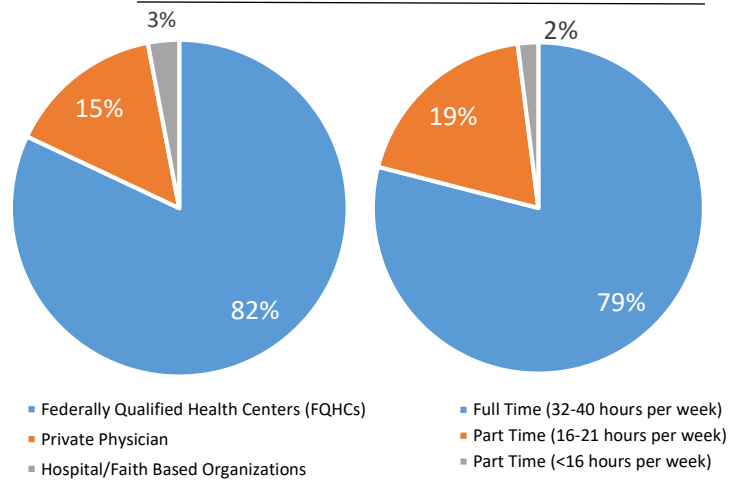


95% of students have asthma severity documented and **80%** have an asthma action plan



90% of students receive instruction on exercise and diet

Sponsorship, Availability, and Staffing



85%

of SBHCs are open during the school year only

of SBHCs are staffed by Nurse Practitioners and Physician Assistants

Utilization, Attendance, and Expansion



50- 400 patients visit SBHCs per month



44% increase in student seat time which correlates with a reduction in the number of school days missed due to health-related issues



65% of SBHCs are planning to expand to other locations
